Grounds for Appeal

An appeal of an examination result will be considered:

- (a) if there is evidence of substantive irregularity in the conduct of the examination;
- (b) if there is evidence that TEG examiners did not follow an established procedure in the grading of the examination;
- (c) if there is evidence of substantive bias by one or more of the examiners in arriving at a decision.

Exclusions

- i. Disagreement with a decision does not constitute valid grounds for an appeal.
- ii. Disappointment with an assessment result or a view that a higher mark should have been obtained does not constitute valid grounds for appeal.
- iii. Complaints about individuals or about the established procedures do not constitute grounds for an appeal.
- iv. A decision that has previously been reviewed or appealed cannot be appealed on the same grounds again.
